The Gurkha Museum Trust awarded grant by The National Lottery Heritage Fund to secure Gurkha heritage for the future

Today, The Gurkha Museum Trust is excited to announce it has been awarded a grant of £2,681,278 from The National Lottery Heritage Fund. This grant will transform The Gurkha Museum from a small military museum into the global reference centre for Gurkha heritage. The Gurkha Museum serves as custodian of the British Army's Brigade of Gurkhas' unique legacy and extensive collection dating back over 210 years. Without funding from the Heritage Fund, Gurkhas stories and artefacts would not be accessible for current and future generations. Known by its Nepali name *Project Kaida*, the Museum's redevelopment plan, will enable four ambitious objectives to be achieved for our nation's heritage.

Renovation of the permanent public galleries स्थायी तथा सार्वजनिक ग्यालरीहरुको नविकरण

With financial support from the Heritage Fund and the Brigade of Gurkhas, The Gurkha Museum will renovate both public galleries to ensure the Gurkha artefacts are accessible to all visitors. This will involve stripping-out the tired thirty-year old displays, and redesigning and refitting the Museum's public galleries to represent the authentic Nepali and Gurkha story through a new dynamic and intuitive layout.

Inspiring educational activity programme प्रेरणादायक शैक्षिक गतिविधि कार्यक्रम

Over the next three-years, there will be a fully funded educational activities programme to inspire and educate current and future generations about the impact Gurkha service and sacrifice have made to our nation and global security.

Digitalisation of the Museum's archives संग्रहालयका वृहत अभिलेखहरुको डिजिटलाइजेसन्

With this funding, The Gurkha Museum Trust will digitalise and catalogue over 30,000 archives to ensure these irreplaceable stories and insights are preserved and protected for future generations. These digitalised archives will be able to be accessed regardless of geographical location.

In anticipation of this funding, The Gurkha Museum has developed an international research, lecture, and education centre that will remain open when the Museum's public galleries are closed and undergoing renovation.

Project Kaida is an ambitious and charitable project, marking a unique, globally renowned military relationship and legacy. To receive The National Lottery Heritage Fund grant The Gurkha Museum must fund-match. Our fundraising efforts are being led by the Brigade of Gurkhas; every serving officer and soldier has donated a day's pay in support of their heritage charity. Project Kaida will only be realised through support from generous donors and funders. The Gurkha Museum will appreciate and recognise every contribution to this historic redevelopment.

In summary, *Project Kaida* involves the full transformation of The Gurkha Museum and how Gurkha heritage is preserved, protected, and promoted for current and future generations. The new accessible public galleries, facilities and capabilities will serve as a tribute to 210 years of Gurkhas' loyal service to the British Crown and global security. With The National Lottery Heritage Fund's delivery award, The Gurkha Museum Trust will transform from a static collection of military artefacts to the global reference centre for Gurkha heritage and Nepali culture.

The Gurkha Museum is based in Winchester and has international reach and support. Over two floors, the public galleries showcase the Gurkhas' history and culture through unique objects. In addition to its impressive collection, library, and research facilities, the Museum boasts a spacious gallery with catering services.

About *Project Kaida*, the future redevelopment of The Gurkha Museum Trust:

The redevelopment of The Gurkha Museum is taking place under *Project Kaida*. *Kaida* is a Nepali word (काइदा) meaning the ethos and customs usually associated with the Brigade of Gurkhas. *Kaida* is the 'Gurkha way' and has been central to the successful contributions of the Gurkhas for over two hundred years of military service.

The purpose of The Gurkha Museum Trust's redevelopment is enshrined in four ambitious objectives:

- Reinterpretation, re-designing and modernisation of the permanent public galleries and physical displays over two-floors at The Gurkha Museum to make the Museum a mustvisit attraction;
- Outreach and education activity programme to take the Gurkha stories into the community in innovative and engaging ways;
- Digitalisation of the archive and related digital projects (including oral history gathering) so the Gurkha story is accessible regardless of your geographic location;
- Refurbishment of the old library into a multi-purpose functional research/education centre holding the Gurkhas' library to enable the Museum to become an international research and education hub on Gurkha heritage.

Project Kaida is supported by serving Gurkha soldiers (via the One Day Pay Scheme), the National Lottery Heritage Fund, other trusts and foundations, and the generosity of individuals.
